Yamamoto New Scalp Acupuncture (YNSA) is an acupuncture technique consisting in a complete system of assessment, diagnosis, and treatment, developed by Dr. Toshikatsu Yamamoto, a renowned Japanese physician specialized in anesthesiology and gynecology, who first introduced it to the international scientific community in 1973.

YNSA is defined as a microsystem of acupuncture, based on a somatotopic representation located at the level of the scalp, according to principles similar to those of auriculotherapy.

Today, YNSA is—after auriculotherapy—one of the most widely used acupuncture microsystems worldwide.



Key features

1.

Use of highly specific somatotopic areas on the scalp

2.

Often immediate clinical response, verifiable during the session

3.

Rational and replicable approach, with solid neurofunctional foundations, aimed at modulation of the nervous system, and suitable for integrated and multidisciplinary settings (incorporable within Western medicine)

4.

Results-oriented method based on test–treatment–verification logic

5.

Immediate applicability in daily clinical practice

6.

Integrated diagnostic system based on cervical, abdominal, and peripheral reference point palpation



Workshop objectives

- To teach the fundamentals of YNSA
- To teach its application in patient treatment
- To provide immediately usable skills, enabling participants to integrate the method into their clinical practice





Methodology

The seminar is primarily structured as a hands-on workshop.

- 1.** Theoretical foundations will be introduced, followed by training in the correct localization of points (highly specific somatotopic areas on the scalp).
- 2.** Therapeutic techniques used in YNSA will then be illustrated.
- 3.** Clinical cases will be presented, on which YNSA techniques will be applied, allowing participants to observe and understand the therapeutic process.

Participants will also have the opportunity to practice stimulation techniques on each other using needles, under supervision.



Outcomes

At the end of the seminar, each participant will have acquired solid knowledge of YNSA and the basic skills to apply it in patient treatment.

The newly acquired skills may become an integral part of the practitioner's therapeutic toolbox.

At the same time, the course aims to encourage further in-depth study, promoting integration of YNSA with other therapeutic approaches and its application across different clinical settings.





Main clinical applications

Acute and chronic pain

Neurological disorders (post-stroke conditions, Parkinson's disease, neuropathies)

Motor rehabilitation

Musculoskeletal disorders

Functional disorders (headache, vertigo)

Psycho-emotional disorders (anxiety, insomnia, stress)
